From the Rector's Desk 🔲

"Alleluia. Christ is risen." So begins the Service on Easter Day: the Sunday of the Resurrection. The response is, "The Lord is risen indeed. Alleluia." It's a wonderful understatement, since most of us would follow any of those phrases with multiple exclamation points: Alleluia!!! Christ is risen!!! Thanks be to God, the Lord is risen indeed. Alleluia!

In the next two months there are opportunities to commemorate some very different people. Several of them were martyrs: Dietrich Bonhoeffer (April 9), who died in 1945; Alphege (April 19), Archbishop of Canterbury, who died in 1012; George (April 23), Patron Saint of England, who died in 303; St, Mark the Evangelist (April 25); and St. Phillip and St. James, Apostles (May 1). There will be opportunities to examine our more recent history, too. St. Phillip's Church in Richmond will be screening "Barbara Johns: The Making of an Icon" on April 25 at 7 pm, a film about the events in Prince Edward County that led to the end of Massive Resistance.

This year's annual Bishop's Spring Conference for Clergy, Lay Professionals, and Spouses will be at Shrine Mont May 6-8. The keynote speaker this year will be the Rev'd Michael Harvey, co-founder of "Back to Church Sunday." Michael speaks particularly about working to invite back those whose church participation has lapsed. He will share stories of his ministry and provide the groundwork for our diocese to take on the challenge of being a truly invitational church. Bishop Shannon Johnston says, "It is my hope that Michael's engaging and spirited message will inspire all of us to meet his challenge of becoming a transformed and even more vibrant church."

Three churches in our Region are in search. Westover Church is in the process of building their profile; St. Peter's, Richmond, is in the very early stages of their transition; and Trinity, Highland Springs, is in search for a new Vicar. In addition, St. John's, West Point, our nearest Episcopal neighbor, is also building their profile.

Finally, my four-year appointment as Dean of Region IX has expired. That means I am no longer "The Very Rev'd." I'm back to just plain old "The Rev'd." It was a long four years, and I wish The Very Rev'd April Greenwood, Vicar of Varina Church and new Dean of Region IX, all the best in her term.

St Peter's Vestry has a commission system designed to provide organization and communication between the Vestry and ministries within the church. During our February 9 retreat we decided on the Vestry representatives for each of the church's commissions. Each member seems to have easily fallen into place. The wardens are not included in the commission system. However, they do have traditional roles. The Senior Warden is usually the primary elected lay leader of the congregation and serves as a principal liaison between the parish and the Rector. The *Junior Warden*, Mark Whidden, is often given responsibility for the upkeep of the parish buildings and grounds. The only specific duty assigned to "churchwardens" in the national canons is to notify the bishop "when the parish is without a rector." I am confident that Paul, Mark, and I do not anticipate any such notification being needed in the year to come.

From him the whole body, joined and held together by every supporting ligament, grows and builds itself up in love, as each part does its work. *Ephesians 4:16*

Through guidance from above, our Vestry has been aligned and is ready to serve the Lord at St. Peter's.



The Winning St. Peter's Soup Cook-off Recipe by Ray O'Leary

Chicken White Bean Soup

- 1 pound chicken strips cooked and cut into bite size pieces (I just use a rotisserie chicken)
- 2 medium onions, chopped and cooked until done
- 6-8 cloves garlic, chopped and cooked with the onion
- 1 16 oz can hominy (drained and rinsed)
- 1 16 oz can white cannellini beans (drained and rinsed)
- 2 small cans roasted green chilies (I use 1 can Rotele diced tomatoes and green chilies)
- 1 small box of chicken stock (or 2 small cans)
- 3 Tbl. fresh basil or 2 tsp. dried basil
- 1 tsp. ground cumin
- 1 tsp. black pepper
- ½ tsp. chili powder
- Chopped cilantro to add at serving
- 2/3 cup sour cream
- 1/3 cup cottage cheese
- ½ cup Half & Half



Put chicken, onion/garlic mixture, hominy, cannellini beans, and chilies in a pot and cover with the chicken stock. If needed, add some water to ensure liquid covers the other stuff. Add spices and cook about 20 minutes.

Mix sour cream, cottage cheese, and Half & Half in a food processor or blender until smooth. Add to the soup and cook another 15 minutes.

Serve with fresh chopped cilantro.

Dear Very Reverend Rowles:

I am pleased to confirm that the Secretary of the Interior, on March 02, 2012, designated St. Peter's Parish Church in New Kent County, Virginia, a National Historic Landmark, in recognition of the property's national significance in the history of the United States.

The Historic Sites Act of 1935 authorizes the Secretary of the Interior to identify and recognize nationally significant places that best represent the American experience. Landmark designation recognizes and encourages the preservation of places that have exceptional value for commemorating or illustrating the history of the United States, for the inspiration and benefit of all Americans.

The Secretary of the Interior designates National Historic Landmarks only after careful study by the National Park Service, extensive opportunities for public involvement, and review and recommendation by the National Park System Advisory Board, in accordance with National Historic Landmark criteria set forth in 36 CFR Part 65. National Historic Landmarks are listed in the National Register of Historic Places, making them eligible for the safeguards and benefits provided by the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966 and other federal laws protecting historic properties.

We are delighted to enroll St. Peter's Parish Church in New Kent County, Virginia, as a National Historic Landmark – a designation that reflects the recognition of this property as an irreplaceable part of our nation's heritage.


