From the Rector's Desk

This is the April-May issue of THE KEYS: from the fifth Sunday in Lent through the seventh Sunday after Easter. In between we find The Sunday of the Passion: Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter Sunday: the Day of Resurrection. This is being written just before the first Sunday in Lent, so for me as I write it's a three-month period that goes from solemnity and sorrow to joy and gladness.

Lent: early Christians observed "a season of penitence and fasting" as they prepared for the Paschal feast (BCP, pp. 264-265). The word "Lent" comes from an Old English word meaning "spring," the season of lengthening days. Originally, in places where Easter was celebrated on Sunday, the Paschal Feast was preceded by a two-day fast. In the third century that fast was expanded to six days, and eventually to forty days, imitating Christ's period of fasting in the wilderness. It was a period in which converts to the faith were prepared for baptism, and those who were guilty of notorious sin(s) were prepared for being restored to the fellowship of the faithful. Not knowing many people who are up to a forty-day fast, I rather suspect that this fast was much like Ramadan, the Muslim holy month, in which the fast covers only daylight hours.

Then, about the year 600 A.D., Pope Gregory "transmogrified" that period into what we now know as Lent: the forty days (excluding Sundays) from Ash Wednesday through Holy Saturday. In the Prayer Book, all Christians are invited "to the observance of a holy Lent, by self-examination and repentance; by prayer, fasting, and self-denial; and by reading and meditating on God's holy Word" (BCP, p. 265).

Then comes Maundy Thursday, part of the *Triduum*, or three holy days before Easter. The name comes from the Latin *mandatum novum*, the "new commandment referred to in *John 13:34.*¹ The celebration commemorates the institution of the Eucharist by Jesus on "the night in which he was betrayed" (BCP, p. 334). At the end of the service the altar is stripped and all decorative furnishings removed from the church.

Good Friday begins with Morning Prayer, followed by the Stations of the Cross at noon. Sometimes called "The Way of the Cross," it is a devotion to the Passion of Christ recalling a series of events at the end of his life, from his condemnation to his burial. The number of stations for prayer and meditation have varied, but fourteen is the usual number. Good Friday ends with a proper liturgy for the day, including John's account of the Passion, intercessions known as the solemn collects (that date from ancient Rome), and finally devotions before the cross, sometimes called "the veneration of the cross."

The culmination comes with Easter, the feast of the resurrection. It is sometimes called in the fine print "the eighth day of creation," which is why many baptismal fonts have eight sides. Faith in the resurrection is at the heart of Christian faith and belief. Then from the "forty days of Lent" we move into "the great fifty days" of Easter, which end on Pentecost, the fiftieth day after Easter, falling on June 4 this year.

Stewardship

Year-Round "Grateful and Responsible Use of God's Gifts" (Stewardship) Program

The word "stewardship" has a negative connotation for many people so I renamed it above. Did you know that with the leadership of our own Lisa Guthrie, St. Peter's developed a year-round "Grateful and Responsible Use of God's Gifts" Program? Several years ago, Lisa took on a big mission to change our thinking and our process to a year-round program. Before this, we were all thinking of our Annual Giving Campaign in the fall as our only "Gifts" campaign— when we make our annual pledge to St. Peter's. Now we have a year-round program consisting of three parts:

- Our fall **Annual Giving Campaign** making monetary gifts or pledges to St. Peter's for ongoing operations (short-term needs); led well and effectively by Kent Bradshaw over the last two years.
- Our **Planned Giving Campaign** with the leadership and dedication of Bob Kay, the Planned Giving Committee was formed in the last two years to develop "Policies & Guidelines" for the Vestry to handle any legacy gift to St. Peter's, including bequests in wills, life income gifts, life insurance policies, real estate, and other assets (learn more at <u>www.stpetersnewkent.org</u>, under "Giving"). These gifts fund our Endowment (St. Peter's Foundation) for long-term funding for items such as construction projects.
- Our Time & Talent Campaign is the final part of our year round "Gifts" Program. This is still in the development stage and we are looking for someone who would be willing to serve as the Chairperson to develop this ministry. The goal would be to serve as a clearing house to match parishioners (newcomers and regulars) with volunteer opportunities and to help commissions, guilds, and other ministries fill needs for volunteers within their organizations. While some efforts have been made in this area in the past, this is not currently an active ministry. Our church members can use their "time & talent" gifts to get involved in ministries such as **Outreach** (Matthew's Haven, Youth Mission Trip, Annual Golf Tournament), Worship (Sidesman, Altar Guild, Acolytes, Lector/Intercessor leader, Choir), **Congregational Care** (attends to the spiritual needs of those parishioners who cannot attend regular worship services whether they are home parishioners or college parishioners), **Buildings & Grounds** (prepares and maintains the buildings and grounds Garden Guild, Cemetery), **Parish Life** (encourages participation through fellowship of all parishioners Fellowship Committee, Resource & Development Committee, EYC-Episcopal Youth Community, Newcomers), **Christian Education** (spiritual development in both children and adults Church School, Nursery helpers, Christmas pageant, Vacation Bible School), and **Stewardship** (faithful stewardship of our gifts including time, talent & treasure, also known as work, wisdom & wealth, through our three parts of Stewardship).

If you would like to lead/help with our **Time & Talent Campaign** effort, please contact Paul or any Vestry member. I want to extend a special thank you to Lisa Guthrie who gave so much of her "time & talent" to develop our year-round "Grateful and Responsible Use of God's Gifts" Stewardship Program!

Finally, we learned the following prayer from Julie Simonton from the Diocese who assisted us in forming our yearround stewardship program:

My Church is composed of people like me. I help make it what it is. It will be friendly, if I am. Its pews will be filled, if I help fill them. It will do great work, if I work. It will make generous gifts to many causes, if I am a generous giver. It will bring other people into its worship and fellowship, if I invite and bring them. It will be a church of loyalty and love, of fearlessness and faith, and a church with a noble spirit, if I, who make it what it is, am filled with these same things. Therefore, with the help of God, I shall dedicate myself to the task of being all the things that I want my church to be. *Amen.*


