From the Rector's Desk

As I said in my letter of February 19, it's been my privilege to have served seven congregations over the last thirty-three years. During that time I've followed a total of five interim ministers or priests-in-charge. Two were very good, one should have permanently retired long before, and two continued to be malign presences within the congregations after I arrived. One waged quiet and surreptitious warfare, while the other was much more open and direct. But even those two taught me a great and important moral lesson: don't be that guy. Don't speak evil of those who come after you. To that end, I pledge to be "the best former cleric possible" to whomever might come after me, either as interim, as priest-in-charge, as *locum tenens*, or as Rector.

After I came to St. Peter's back in 2006, the Diocese finally came up with some guidelines for "resigning priests." You can find the document [here](#). I'd like to quote a few of those guidelines and then respond to them, so you'll have a better idea what to expect after August 31 this year.

It is expected that the resigning priest will worship at another Episcopal church, or a different congregation of their choice.

There's no expiration date on this, so it sounds like permanent banishment! You certainly won't see us on a regular Sunday morning for quite some time, but after your new permanent person has been here for a while, it's possible that we'd have a conversation about our coming back from time to time.

In order to facilitate the transfer of leadership, the resigning priest is discouraged from presiding at the sacramental rites of the church, particularly the Sunday Eucharist, baptisms, weddings and funerals.

If in the future your new permanent person should ask me to come back and assist at one of these "sacramental rites," it's possible that I would consider that. But the request would have to come from your new person. My response to such requests from previous congregations has always been something like, "I'll be happy to assist your new Rector in whatever way he wishes."

For those resigning priests who remain geographically proximate to their former cures, it is not appropriate to exercise pastoral visits and hospital care that are in the normal purview of the incumbent.

This one can be tricky, and it's come up before. If a former congregant who's been a good friend finds him/herself in hospital or hospice or some other distress, it seems rather cruel on my part to say "Sorry, I can't come see you." On the other hand, it needs to be clear that my visit would be a "friend" visit and not a pastoral visit. Boundaries matter here, and how we separate what I have been (Priest & friend) from what I now am (friend who is a priest) is important. For example, I won't be bringing you home or hospital communion unless your new person asks me to.

It is never appropriate for the resigning priest to discuss any parish business with any present vestry member or other lay leader. It is always appropriate to answer the incumbent clergy's questions about any historical parish business that is relevant to a present decision.

This doesn't mean, for example, that if you tell me the parking lot and access roads repaving project is finally getting underway I won't rejoice greatly! It does mean that I won't be offering advice as to how it could be financed. And if your new person has some historical question – "Tell me what happened when" or "do you remember," I'll cheerfully tell what I know, always with the caveat that maybe I don't know what I think I do. (Good advice in all circumstances!)

It is never appropriate to engage in evaluative conversations about one's successor.

Here is a promise in bold print: **You will never hear a critical word from me spoken in public regarding any successor of mine.** And please hold me to that! If I have some criticism or helpful comment, only s/he will hear it, and only in private. No Facebook posts telling the world what a terrible job they're doing, or how I would have done it better, cheaper, quicker, and so on. No dinner parties discussing their manifold sins and shortcomings. We leave here with a deep and abiding love for St. Peter's and its people. How could we wish you all anything but the absolute best in the days ahead? Our prayers are that God will continue to guide you as you make your way forward toward a bright and shining future.

If you have any questions or concerns; or if you have any thoughts or opinions on this or any matter relating to the life of the church, please contact a member of the Vestry. We want to hear from you. We need to hear from you. Together, we represent one thing about St. Peter's that will never change: our strength comes from our people.



Sausage & Cheese Chowdah – Paul's Winning Soup Recipe

(Serves Four)

- 3 tbsp. butter
- 1 c. chopped carrots
- 1 c. chopped celery
- 1/3 c. chopped onion
- 3 tbsp. flour
- 2 c. water
- 1/2 tsp. salt
- 1/2 tsp. celery salt
- 1/4 tea. paprika
- 1/8 tsp. pepper
- 1 12-oz can corn & peppers
- 2 1/2 c. sharp cheese
- 1 lb. sausage, crumbled and browned
- 1 14-oz can evaporated milk



Heat butter, carrots, celery, and onions until bubbly. Reduce heat, cover, and simmer for 20 minutes. Stir in flour, cook over low heat, stirring constantly, until bubbly.

Stir in all but cheese and sausage. Cook on medium heat. Stir in cheese gradually, stirring until melted. Stir in sausage and heat. Enjoy!
