From the Rector's Desk 🔲

"Tweet if you love Jesus!"

That was the headline of the cover story on the latest – and, unfortunately, last – issue of Episcopal Church Foundation's VESTRY PAPERS. After the November/December 2010 issue, the print version will be replaced by an online presence: *ECF Vital Practices*, available at www.ecfvp.org. Much of what follows is drawn from information presented in that final printed issue.

"We live in a rapidly changing world in which means of communication are evolving exponentially. We have the most important message in the world and some of us are sending it by pony express," the article says. "Facebook now has 350 million members. If it were a country, it would be the third largest in the world." Furthermore, "during the Reformation of the sixteenth century the church was quick to seize upon the opportunities presented by the newly invented printing press, but since then it has lagged behind the curve of technology ... slow to realize the potential of 20th century mass media." The article goes on to list four practical suggestions for "taking that quantum leap into new communication technologies."

- 1. <u>If you do not already have a basic website for your church, create one</u>. We do. In fact, we have a very good website: <u>www.stpetersnewkent.org</u>. Rod Molina is the webmaster. That should be a good portal for almost any information you're looking for, be it history or service times or THE KEYS.
- 2. <u>Set up a Fan Page on Facebook</u>. We have that, too. There's a link to it on our church website or you can go to <u>www.facebook.com</u> and search for it under St. Peter's Parish Church. There's also a *Facebook* page for our Youth Group. Simply go to *Facebook* and search for St. Peter's EYC.
- 3. Make sure your clergy person has a *Facebook* page and comments on it every day or so. He does. Go to *Facebook* and search for Paul Rowles. Specify "New Kent" and look for the US Army tank picture. Make sure you get the right one! There are about twenty of us, some of whom look much more interesting (and much more buff!) than me. I don't always post on my own wall every day, but I try to visit every day to keep up with what's happening. I don't always post something church-related; sometimes it's just something that's struck me as funny or relevant. I try to avoid political things, but sometimes our politicians make of themselves very inviting targets. In that case, I try for fairness and equal skewering!
- 4. <u>Use Twitter to quickly get in touch with your staff, vestry, and leadership</u>. That's the one thing we don't do. We don't have a Twitter account, and I don't follow anyone on Twitter. There was one parishioner whom I followed for a while, but his Tweets have gone silent.

Wardens' Corner

During the last meeting of the 2010 Vestry, the issue of stewardship was discussed during the development of the 2011 church budget. Dr. Steve Peterson led the most recent stewardship program for our church and reported back to the Vestry the various trends, opportunities, and financial challenges that St. Peter's will face for 2011 and what we may anticipate for the future. Using this information and the excellent budget model prepared by Treasurer Stuart Burnett, the Vestry successfully crafted and approved a 2011 budget for St. Peter's.

But what about that discussion about Stewardship? In Dr. Peterson's review, he made the comment that he did not think the campaign had been as successful as he had hoped. Other Vestry members did not fully share this opinion and expressed their gratitude for his leadership in this important program. Examining the data for 2011, pledging units did not appear to grow. However, there was an increase in the amount pledged. For example, all pledging members of the Vestry increased their pledges for 2011.

But what about that discussion about Stewardship? Let's take a look at what Paul was writing in Romans 12 which may be paraphrased as "Humble Service in the Body of Christ." Paul writes:

For by the grace given me I say to every one of you: Do not think of yourself more highly than you ought, but rather think of yourself with sober judgment, in accordance with the faith God has distributed to each of you. For just as each of us has one body with many members, and these members do not all have the same function, so in Christ we, though many, form one body, and each member belongs to all the others. We have different gifts, according to the grace given to each of us. If your gift is prophesying, then prophesy in accordance with your faith; if it is serving, then serve; if it is teaching, then teach; if it is to encourage, then give encouragement; if it is giving, then give generously; if it is to lead, do it diligently; if it is to show mercy, do it cheerfully.

In these verses, Paul clearly understood the many forms of giving and encouraged the early Christians to act with their best gifts.

IN GOD'S HANDS

Would you like to help your neighbors in New Kent and Charles City? Read on to learn more about a local mission program happening June 20 – June 24 this summer.

In God's Hands Service Camp, sponsored by Providence Forge Presbyterian Church, has extended an invitation to St. Peter's parishioners to participate in this weeklong camp. In the past, the camp focused on PFPC youth to provide the manpower. Recognizing the desire for adults to have an opportunity to help in a local outreach mission, this year, adults are invited and encouraged to volunteer for two – five days during the camp. Adults will be placed on sites working with other adults. Typical services include scraping and painting, rebuilding porches, gutter replacement, cleaning up, and hauling away debris. The Service Camp team will provide the sites, the materials and supplies for the site's work, lunch, and a site supervisor. For adults, this is a day camp, meaning you return home at night. The cost is \$100 per participant to cover expenses. You are asked to provide your own tool belt with basic tools. The week begins Sunday, June 19, with a supper and a worship service at PFPC. This gives time to meet and get to know each other as well as to learn more about the upcoming week. Registration must be received by February 28. Fees are due upon registration. How can you sign up? Matthew's Haven would like to express our sincere gratitude for the contributions and sponsorships of children for our annual *Give a Child a Christmas* event. We either sponsored or found sponsorships for 60 children, 26 of whom were sponsored by our own parish family. Sometimes we take on more children because I find we are blessed with sponsors who want to help more children, and sometimes, based on the children's situations, I just can't say *no*. Somehow, some way, God sees us through.

But what about that discussion about Stewardship?

As for the issue of stewardship within St. Peter's, I believe we are blessed with members that possess a multitude of talents and gifts. Constant Contact as our e-mail manager. If you are already receiving our e-mail, you don't need to do anything. If you are not, please go to our website, scroll down to the bottom, and find the "Join our e-mail" link. You'll notice two changes with Constant Contact: e-mail will now come from a St. Peter's e-mail address and not Joyce's, and the look and feel of the email will be more consistent, making it immediately recognizable as an official St. Peter's email. One very important thing not to be missed is that we are moving towards making THE KEYS primarily available online and not via US Mail. If you're not on our e-mail list, you won't get THE KEYS. We will, of course, continue to send out copies to those without computer access, but the primary method of distribution will be an e-mailed link to THE KEYS. assist the sponsors by providing suggestions of what a child would like or need for Christmas. It provides clothing sizes, favorite colors, and hobbies. All of this information is to help us purchase items for the child. I have found personally, and also heard from others, the wish lists are invaluable when buying items for a child we don't know. It increases our excitement in shopping for that child, because we know we are getting them something special or something that they really need. We anticipate the child will be excited Christmas morning.

The wish lists are generally completed by the parents, case workers, or social workers. But occasionally the child themselves will fill them out. These are generally the ones that I can not say *no* to. These are children that I believe we must sponsor even if all of our sponsorships are gone. To see their handwriting, misspellings, and descriptions on their wish lists is very heartwarming and sometimes heart-wrenching.

For example, this year we had a brother and sister on our list. The brother is 15 and the sister is 12. The only thing these children asked for were toiletry items they could use to wash their bodies, clean their teeth, and smell good. How heart-wrenching is that? Of all the things they could have asked for, they asked for something so basic, something so simple that you and I take for granted and have every day on our shelves at home. Can you imagine not being able to get these items for your child or even for yourself? Can you imagine having to say, "we need bread so we won't be able to get shampoo to wash our hair this week"?

Well, these same children were given a supply of toiletry items that would last them many weeks to come; along with other items like clothing; books, because the girl likes to read; magazines, because the boy likes to hunt and fish. We also purchased socks, underwear, and pajamas for them.

So, this is the reason I can't say *no*! This is the reason I want and hope to be able to make the number we sponsor for Christmas and the number we help throughout the year continue to grow. Thank you all for everything you do to support Matthew's Haven, not just at Christmas, but throughout the year.


