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From the Rector's Desk

Another Annual Parish Meeting has come and gone. We did it a little differently this year, and so far the feedback has been quite good. Instead of having each person read their reports, we asked people to submit their reports early, then printed them and handed them out at the meeting. We also held the meeting at 10 am, concurrent with a coffee hour. The 8:30 Service folks could stay a little late, and the 11:00 Service folks could come a little early. Instead of having the meeting in the church, we had it in Richardson Hall. People could have their coffee and cookies during the meeting, which everyone appreciated. Bill Lindsey, our outgoing Senior Warden, caught us up on the 2011 HVAC (heat, ventilation, and air conditioning) project. Short version: 99% done, with just a few teething problems to correct. Well done! Three new members of the Vestry were elected: Patrick Evelyn, Bill O'Keefe, and Mark Whidden. Welcome to the class of 2015! Bill Lindsey and Denise Fazio completed their three-year terms of service on the Vestry. Stuart Burnett took off his Vestry hat once more, having fulfilled an unexpired term, but continues as Treasurer. Thanks to all three of you for all your work over this past year. The new members were commissioned at the Services on January 15.

The first meeting of the Vestry was, as always, a long one. The financial report for December 2011 was accepted, and the budget for 2012 was approved. Rod Molina was elected Senior Warden, and Tony Wood was elected Junior Warden. Stuart Burnett was re-elected as Treasurer while Mark Whidden was re-elected as Assistant Treasurer. Ann Bradshaw was elected Register, and Bill O'Keefe was re-elected Chair of the Clopton Scholarship Committee. David Swynford, Lisa Guthrie, and Bruce Lange were named as the Finance Committee. Finally, the date of the Vestry retreat was set as February 4, at St. John's, West Point.

The two months ahead mark the end of Epiphany and the beginning of Lent. On Friday, February 3, we'll have a Chili Cook-off at 6 pm, followed by Family Game Night at 7 pm. The annual Sweetheart Breakfast will be on Sunday, February 12 between the two Services. And as usual, Shrove Tuesday pancakes will be the last celebration of the season: February 21 at 6 pm. Ash Wednesday, February 22, marks the beginning of Lent, with the Liturgy of the Day observed at 7 pm.

In the cold and damp of this winter season, let us not forget those whose houses – if they have them – are not as warm as ours, and those whose tables are not quite as adequately set. In this season when politics seems to consume us, let us resolve to "agree to disagree." Our allegiance is to Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior, not to our political parties or persuasions, none of whom may speak for God. As the subtitle of Jim Wallis' 2005 book GOD'S POLITICS: A NEW VISION FOR FAITH AND POLITICS IN AMERICA has it, "God is not a Republican or a Democrat." Let us resolve to pray for our country, to pray for the candidates, but also let us resolve to pray for each other, even those – or *especially* those – with whom we disagree.




From the Editor

Parish Life continued



The Rector's Cross

The Rector's Cross was an award established two years ago to recognize individuals for outstanding contributions to the work of St. Peter's Parish Church. Sometimes that work has been very visible, and sometimes it's been behind the scenes. This year we recognized two people for their dedication and hard work in two very different areas.

Ken Rubert was one who saw a need and stepped forward. When our hydronic HVAC system failed in the early part of the year, he realized that he could handle the contracting and supervisory duties himself, rather than hiring an outside engineering firm. The process took the better part of a year, mostly due to the complexity of the system and the restrictions of working with an historic structure whose appearance could not be altered. Assisted by a number of people, most notably Tony Wood and Major Mansfield, a new propane-fueled two-boiler high efficiency system was installed, the old 1,000 gallon oil tank was removed and a new propane tank installed, the underground hydronic loop to the church was replaced (with provisions for future maintenance and/or upgrades), a new on-demand hot water heater was installed and the old 80-gallon electric water heater was removed, new programmable thermostats were installed, a large amount of debris was removed from the boiler room, the floor was painted with an epoxy coating, electrical systems were upgraded and repaired, and plumbing issues were corrected – the list is far too long to reprint here. The end result was that we have a system that should last us for fifty years (assuming it's properly maintained) and should be vastly more energy-efficient than our old oil-fired system. He also saved us, conservatively speaking, over \$50,000.00 by doing the engineering, contracting, and supervisory work himself.

Kim McLean assumed the duties of Chair of the Altar Guild in 2007 when Roberta Luce, her predecessor, retired. Roberta served for many years in that capacity, first working with and then succeeding her mother-in-law, Salena Kirk, who had filled that role for many years before Roberta took over. Salena's service dates at least to the very early 1950s. In fact, almost no one in St. Peter's can remember a time before Selena led the Altar Guild, meaning that between the two of them, they led the Altar Guild for almost sixty years at least! It is very difficult to follow someone – or in this case two "someones" – who have done something like that for so long. But Kim stepped into those shoes and has led the Altar Guild quite well these past four years. Perhaps her greatest accomplishment has been a total revision of the ALTAR GUILD HANDBOOK. She has also coordinated the work of the various Altar Guild teams, conducted training events, recruited new members, and rearranged the teams when people have come and gone. Kim has worked closely with the Rector to coordinate special services, replace linens and altar hangings as needed, and insure all the necessary supplies are in place. For her part, she is quite grateful for all those who are part of the Altar Guild, and appreciates all the time and effort the team members put into their duties. It is a rewarding duty, she feels, and she encourages others to join her in this important work.



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
