From the Rector's Desk 📖

As promised, more about baptism this month.

We start from this point: "Holy Baptism is full initiation by water and the Holy Spirit into Christ's Body the Church (BCP 298). In baptism, God establishes a bond with each person which is "indissoluble." Baptism is "the sacrament by which God adopts us as his children and makes us members of Christ's Body, the Church, and inheritors of the kingdom of God" (BCP 858). Baptism is the foundation for all future church participation and ministry. The one thing that all Christians share is their baptism.

Each person presented for baptism, whether infant or adult, is to be sponsored by one or more adult(s) who must be a baptized person. Tradition is that there are two sponsors of the same sex as the candidate and one of the opposite sex, but this is not a requirement. Sponsors – who used to be called "godparents" – speak on behalf of candidates for baptism who are infants or younger children and cannot speak for themselves. During the baptismal rite, members of the congregation promise to do all they can to support the candidate(s) in their life in Christ (BCP 303). They also join with the candidate(s) in renewing their own baptismal covenant.

The water of baptism is administered either by immersion, familiar to any former Baptist, or by affusion – pouring water over the candidate's head (BCP 307). They are baptized with the Trinitarian formula: "In the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit" (BCP 307), and then marked on the fore-

head with the sign of the cross. The Celebrant may use oil blessed by the Bishop for this purpose. The oil is called "oil of chrism," and the act is called "chrismation." By this, the newly baptized is "sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and marked as Christ's own for ever" (BCP 308). When all have been baptized, the newly baptized are welcomed into the household of God by the Celebrant and congregation.

"Holy Baptism is appropriately administered within the Eucharist as the chief service on a Sunday or other feast" (BCP 298). For us, "appropriately" would be "normally." Sometimes (for "appropriate" reasons!) Holy Baptism is administered at the early, non-chief service, but only in very rare circumstances would we have a private baptism. We baptize infants "so that they can share citizenship in the Covenant, membership in Christ, and redemption by God" (BCP 858). The promises made at baptism are made for infants and children by their parents and sponsors "who guarantee that the infants will be brought up within the Church, to know Christ and be able to follow him" (BCP 859).

Next question: When? "Holy Baptism is especially appropriate at the Easter Vigil, on the Day of Pentecost, on All Saints' Day or the Sunday after All Saints' Day, and on the Feast of the Baptism of our Lord (the First Sunday after the Epiphany). It is recommended that, as far as possible, Baptisms be reserved for these occasions or when a bishop is present" (BCP 312). These days are called "Baptismal Feasts." We have had Baptisms outside of those days, but we try to avoid that. Baptisms are also not appropriate during Lent or Advent due to the penitential nature of these seasons, unless they are emergency baptisms.

Finally, a note on baptismal fonts. They can be found in many shapes, sizes, and locations. Many are located at the liturgical west of the nave because it is through the waters of baptism that we enter the church. Others,

Enter His gates with thanksgiving, and into His courts with praise. Be thankful to Him, and bless His name. *Psalm* 100:4

Of all the things we have to be thankful for, we should be most grateful and give thanks daily for the gift of Jesus Christ. What greater gift have we received than his sacrifice on the cross?

Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God; and the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guide your hearts and minds through Jesus Christ. *Philippians* 4:6-7

Happy thanksgiving.

such as the one at the Cathedral Church of St. Peter and St. Paul (the National Cathedral), are in the center of the Nave because baptism is the center of our life in Christ. Many are also eight-sided, symbolic of baptism being the "eighth day of creation" and that we are new creatures in Christ after our baptisms.

On a different theme, Adult Christian Education has gotten off to a good start this fall. We meet at 10 am in the Mullins Room and yes, you may bring your coffee! We're working through a resource by Nancy Dering Martin called WORDS IN THREES. Many of the great concepts in the prayer book come to us in groups of "words in threes." 
